- repair damaged work relations
- enhance individual empathy and accountability
- prevent future conflict

- the myths that prevent corporations from resolving conflict

- how to facilitate your own Circle.

The first day is for those new to Circles and the second day is for those who wish to become Circle Facilitators. At the end of the two days participants should be able to facilitate their own Corporate Circles.



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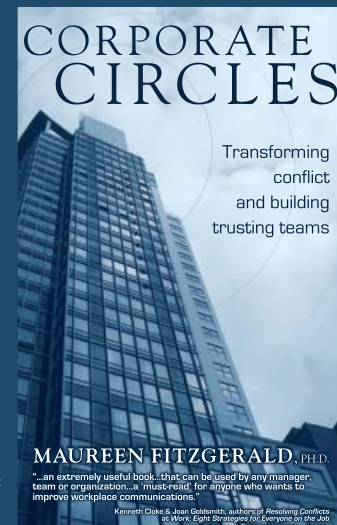
